### **Susan Jin Davis**

**Chief Sustainability Officer**

Susan has over 25 years of experience in the communications, media, and technology industry. Currently, she is responsible for identifying sustainable strategies and priorities and for implementing

Comcast's Sustainability Program across all business units and functions. In 2011, Susan negotiated a historic Memorandum of Understanding between Comcast and the Asian American community as part of the Company's merger with NBCUniversal that creates ground-breaking commitments in the areas of programming, supplier and employment diversity, and community investment. She serves on Comcast's Internal Diversity Council and is a company liaison to the Comcast and NBCUniversal Joint Diversity Council. displacement, Mei founded community initiative, the W.O.W. Project out of a desire to amplify community voices and stories through art, culture and activism. In 2017, Mei was recognized as an emerging voice in the APA community from NBC Asian America and was one of the honorees at the Museum of Chinese in America's Annual Community Heroes Celebration. Most recently, Mei was a National Art Strategies' Creative Community Fellow working on future plans for the W.O.W. Project and Wing on Wo.

Born and raised in Singapore, Michelle is of mixed Chinese-American heritage. After majoring in politics at the University of Virginia, she spent two years in Senegal as an urban agriculture Peace Corps Volunteer
